### MINUTES OF THE YHACS MEETING HELD ON 6<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2018 AT THE CENTRE FOR CREATIVITY, WAKEFIELD

#### DELEGATES PRESENT AND APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

#### 1. Welcome from Kevin Trickett

Kevin welcomed everyone to Wakefield. He explained that Wakefield Civic Society which was hosting the event had been formed in 1964. They have offices at the town hall and run a variety of activities, including social nights, blue plaques, heritage walks, and have produced a number of publications.

#### 2. Minutes of last meeting held on 28<sup>th</sup> July 2018 at Ripon.

These were proposed by Steve Kimber, seconded by Alison Drake and approved by the meeting.

#### 4. Chairman's Report

Kevin drew attention to the latest YHACS Newsletter. Members may send articles to the editor, David Moss, at any time.

Blue plaques had been much in the news lately with an article in *The Times* suggesting there were too many of them. Whether you agree with this or not, when putting up plaques it is essential to get the facts right and they need to be checked carefully – Kevin highlighted one instance of a person being commemorated on two different blue plaques but where different birth and death years had been given (the local civic society has since corrected theirs).

The YHACS Design Workshops provisionally organised for November have had to be deferred to February 2019 due to the one of the presenters' forthcoming hospitalization.

There had also been press coverage of the Charity Commission and their comments that 40% of small charities do not meet the requirements on annual reporting. Kevin drew attention to an article he had written for the YHACS newsletter on the subject and recommended that anyone responsible for writing annual reports have a look at it.

The Civic Voice conference in Birmingham on 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> October is coming up and tickets are still available. Kevin said that it would be good to see a larger turnout from YHACS members.

#### 5. Treasurer's Report

In Richard Ward's absence Kevin reported that 38 societies were members with one sub still outstanding for 2018-19. The bank balance is £5,693.71.

## 6. Guest Speakers

**Ben Dave** of the Yorkshire Society gave an illustrated talk about his running career and his recent charity run along the border of Yorkshire, starting and finishing at Scarborough. The border does always not run along roads and tracks and some of the going was tough underfoot. He started running at the end of 2016 when he suffered from depression and has now raises funds for CALM (Campaign Against Living Miserably), a charity leading the movement against male suicide, which is the single biggest killer of men under 45 in the UK.

**Sarah Cobham** spoke on the Forgotten Women of Wakefield and the role of Dream Time Creative in attempting to increase the number of blue plaques for women with the aim of reaching parity in Wakefield by 2028. A number of notable Wakefield women were in the process of being commemorated, including Edith Mackie, philanthropist, Florence Beaumont, suffrage leader, Louise Fennell, artist and Alice Bacon MP. [Dream Time Creative](#) raises funding through grants and at present the cost of each blue plaque averages around £4,200 if full the cost of volunteer and staff time is quantified and included. They acknowledge that many civic societies usually do much of the research work and publicity using volunteers but in Wakefield, they are working with the civic society by undertaking the work for the plaques nominated as part of the Dream Time Creative project. They are keen to involve schools and the wider community and recommend 'blue plaques for women' as a recruitment opportunity for civic societies willing to consider setting up their own projects.

**Fran Smith and Kate Watson** gave a presentation on [BEAM](#), a Wakefield-based charity concerned with commissioning public art and place-making across the region and nationally. They viewed public art as important in making great places, and supported the promotion of the role of artists and the arts. ## 7. Update on Civic Voice Matters

Helen Kidman reminded members to vote for their favourite Conservation Area on the Civic Voice website. She advised that the Regional Forum was considering the issue of the loss of conservation staff and conservation areas at risk. Among key messages the forum sent to the CV board was the need to publicise Conservation Area Advisory Committees and Architects Panels.

A new regional association was being set up in the East of England and CV was providing support to the West Midlands regional association.

## 8. Just a Minute – a round-up of news and views from local societies (where each society present gets to speak for just one minute!)

Beverley CS encouraged all societies to take part in Heritage Open Days.

Ilkley CS had been party to a group of objectors that had managed to obtain a secretary of state call-in to a LA-approved plan for 500 houses on green belt at Burley in Wharfedale. A public inquiry will now follow.

Scarborough CS reported that work is proceeding at Dean Road chapel and a bid is being prepared for £840k to turn it into a community hub.

Grimsby CS reported that regeneration funding for the Docks (the Kasbah) has been granted.

Selby CS alerted members to new 40ft high phone masts to facilitate smart metering. They were challenging both the siting and height of these masts. Peter Spawforth added that some of these masts are bound to get through the planning system, especially if local civic societies did not act

as the eyes and ears of the community by making representations when planning applications are put forward.

Spenn Valley reported that a community wood to commemorate the late Jo Cox MP was going ahead with LA support.
